○ **Successful Afterschool Programming**

Afterschool programs have a different culture from day school. Themes ranges from academic support to sports, to the arts and all are ways of creating a social community. Subjects: steps to building a culture, lesson plans, communication.

○ **To Thine Own Self Be True**

To understand youth, you must first understand yourself.
Erikson's Developmental Stages is a powerful theory that cannot be emphasized enough for its impact on how youth receive knowledge and how educators recognize their own growth and challenges. Subjects: Explore root causes, concept of self-identity, self-development.
