

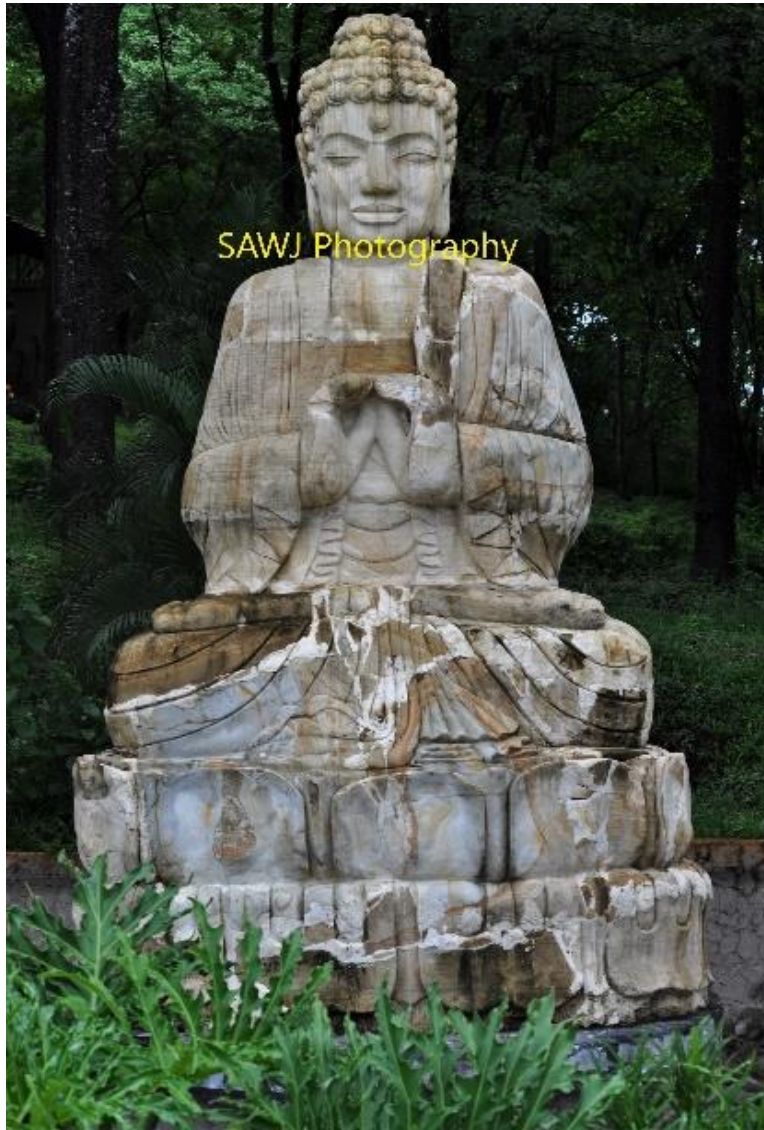
Which Way? That way!
